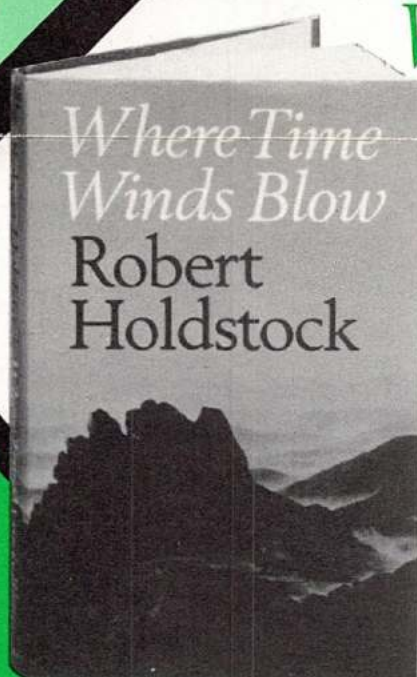

Where Time Winds Blow ROBERT HOLDSTOCK

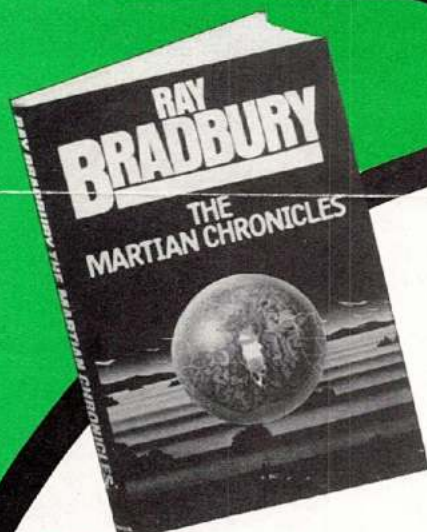

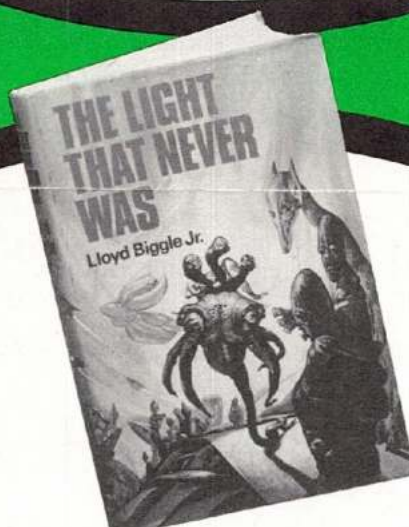

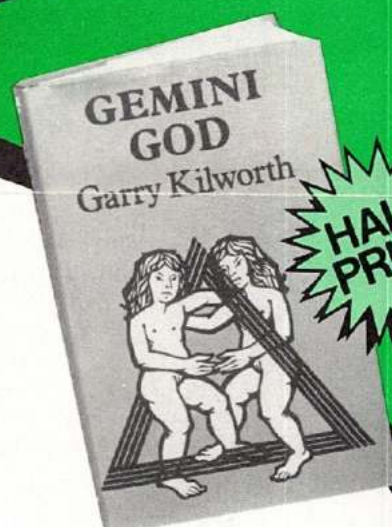
