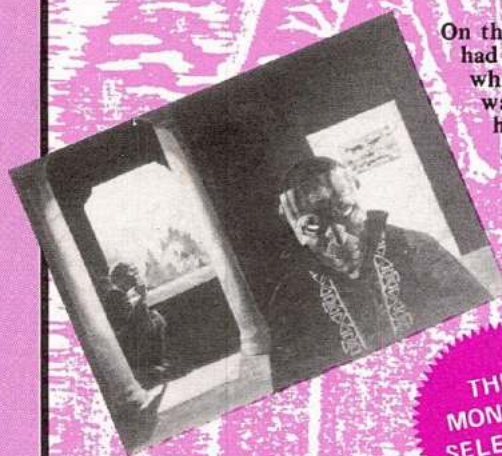

CLIFFORD D. SIMAK PROJECT POPE



On the Rim planet — aptly named End of Nothing — a bizarre society of robots and humans had toiled for a thousand years to create the perfect religion: the new and all-embracing faith, which was, however, no novelty in a galaxy crowded with religions. But one crucial project was hidden from the hordes of pilgrims welcomed at Vatican-17. A group of highly trained human sensitives were sending their minds exploring, ranging through all of time and space, gathering all the information that could ever exist anywhere. And with that information, a computer of infinite knowledge, ultimate wisdom and infallibility was being constructed in secret — the ultimate Pope.

Clifford D. Simak has written more than 30 books, and in 1977 he received the Nebula Grand Master Award. He was born and raised in southwestern Wisconsin, a land of wooded hills and deep ravines, and often uses this locale as a basis for his stories. *Project Pope* is his most unusual novel, deeply thoughtful, richly colourful in character and concept, and packed full of the atmospheric magic for which Simak has long been renowned. 313pp

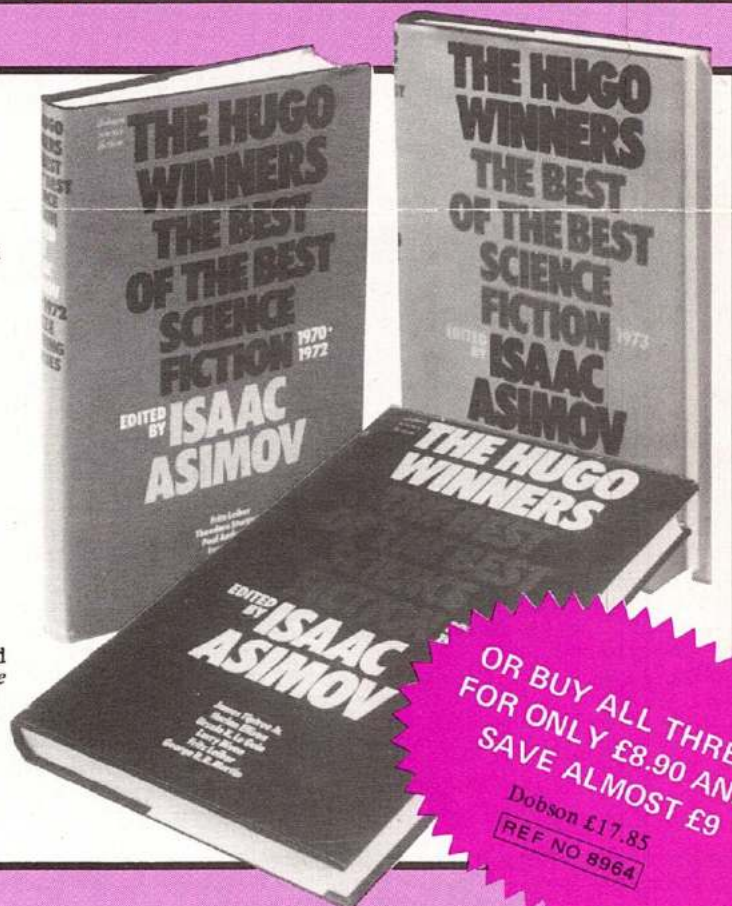
