Mardoc is the ultimate weapon, a weapon built at the height of the Intergalactic War, but a weapon which was never used because of its fearful potential.

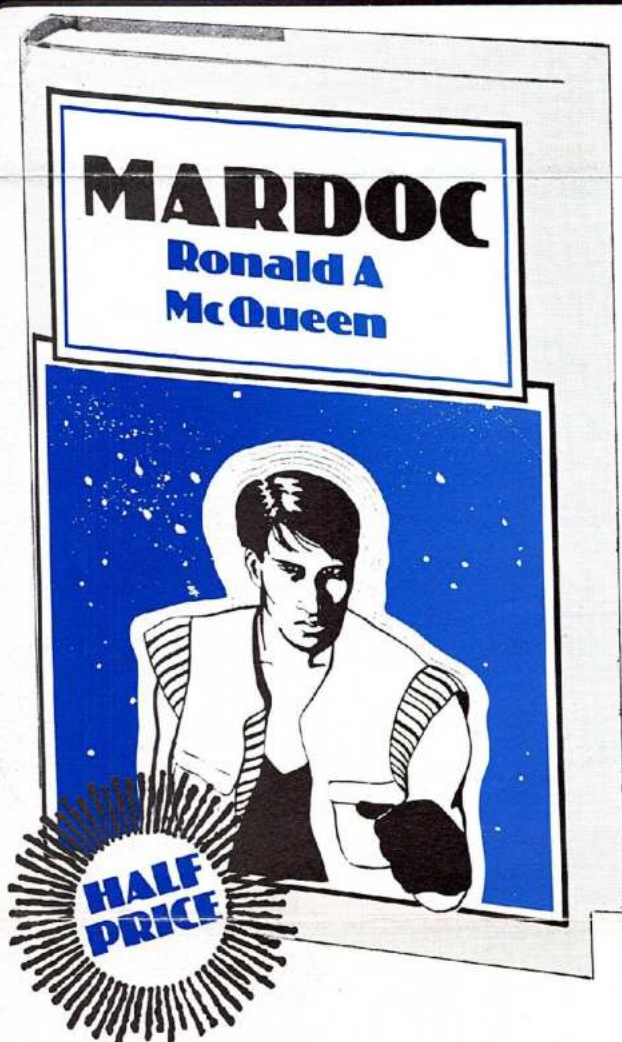
And now **Mardoc** is on the loose again... uncontrollable, unstoppable, and programmed to destroy. 205pp

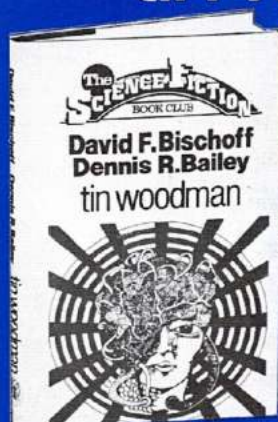
Tin Woodman – the slumbering metal axeman in the land of Oz and now, in the 24th century, an alien starship: metallic, dormant, empty – but alive...
