MEMBERS of SFBC may be glad to know something about the activities of the British Science Fiction Association. It was formed in 1958 by a group of interested people—authors, publishers, booksellers and readers—and its aim is to encourage the writing, publishing and reading of good science fiction, fantasy fiction and kindred forms of literature. It has a very large library, available to members only, through the post, of science fiction and fantasy in both hard-cover and paperback editions, with a section, too, on inter-planetary travel. It also has a very extensive library of magazine science fiction. It issues its own magazine, *Vector*, every six weeks, and this is distributed to members of the B.S.F.A. free of charge. It holds an annual Convention, usually at Easter, and arranges correspondence between sf enthusiasts. Fuller details can be obtained from the Secretary: R. J.
